SECTION 1. G.S. 115D-40.1(e) reads as rewritten:

7 Exception to Participation in Federal Loan Programs. - Notwithstanding subsection "(e) 8 (d) of this section, the board of trustees of a college may adopt a resolution declining to 9 participate in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program. The board of trustees of any college that has declined to participate in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program 10 through the adoption of a resolution may rescind the resolution and participate in the Program 11 but shall not have the authority to again decline participation in the Program. 12

This subsection applies only to Alamance Community College, Beaufort County 13 Community College, Bladen Community College, Brunswick Community College, Caldwell 14 15 Community College and Technical Institute, Central Carolina Community College, Central Piedmont Community College, Cleveland Community College, Gaston College, James Sprunt 16 Community College, Lenoir Community College, Martin Community College, Mitchell 17 18 Community College, Montgomery Community College, Pamlico Community College, Randolph Community College, Richmond Community College, Robeson Community College, 19 Rockingham Community College, Rowan-Cabarrus Community College, Sandhills 20 Community College, and Stanly Community College, Surry Community College, and Sampson 21 Community College, South Piedmont Community College, and Vance-Granville Community 22 College, Wilkes Community College." 23
