2	SECTION 3. The amendments set out in Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall be
3	submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the general election on November 6, 2012,
4	which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots,
5	voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes.
6	The question to be used in the voting systems and ballots shall be:
7	"[] FOR [] AGAINST
8	Term Limits: Constitutional amendments providing that no person shall serve as
9	Speaker of the House of Representatives for more than four consecutive terms in that office and
10	no person shall serve as President Pro Tempore of the Senate for more than four consecutive
11	terms in that office."
12	SECTION 4. If a majority of the votes cast on the question are in favor of the
13	amendments set out in Sections 1 and 2 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the
14	amendments to the Secretary of State, and the amendments become effective upon certification.
15	The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendments so certified among the permanent records of
16	that office.
17	SECTION 5. This act is effective when it becomes law.
