7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	SECTION 1.(a) Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
9	Article to read:
10	" <u>Article 23A.</u>
11	"Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services.
12	"§ 120-208. Creation and membership of Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on
13	Health and Human Services.
14	The Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services is established.
15	The Committee consists of 22 members as follows:
16	(1) <u>Eleven members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of</u>
17	the Senate, at least two of whom are members of the minority party.
18	(2) <u>Eleven members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker</u>
19	of the House of Representatives, at least three of whom are members of the
20	minority party.
21	Terms on the Committee are for two years and begin on the convening of the General
22	Assembly in each odd-numbered year. Members may complete a term of service on the
23	Committee even if they do not seek reelection or are not reelected to the General Assembly, but
24	resignation or removal from service in the General Assembly constitutes resignation or removal
25	from service on the Committee.
26	A member continues to serve until a successor is appointed. A vacancy shall be filled
27	within 30 days by the officer who made the original appointment.
