G.S. 130A-1.1(b) is rewritten to read: 1 2 "(b) A local health department shall assure that the following 10 essential public health 3 services are available and accessible to the population in each county served by the local health 4 department: 5 Monitoring health status to identify community health problems. **(1)** Diagnosing and investigating health hazards in the community. 6 (2) 7 Informing, educating, and empowering people about health issues. (3) Mobilizing community partnerships to identify and solve health problems. 8 (4) 9 Developing policies and plans that support individual and community health (5) efforts. 10 11 Enforcing laws and regulations that protect health and ensure safety. (6) Linking people to needed personal health care services and assuring the 12 (7) 13 provision of health care when otherwise unavailable. 14 Assuring a competent public health workforce and personal health care **(8)** workforce. 15 Evaluating effectiveness, accessibility, and quality of personal and 16 (9) 17 population-based health services. Conducting research. 18 (10)As used in this section, the term "essential public health services" means those services that 19 20 the State shall ensure because they are essential to promoting and contributing to the highest level of health possible for the citizens of North Carolina. The Commission for Public Health shall determine specific services to be provided under each of the essential public health services categories listed above."

SECTION 3. The Department of Health and Human Services shall allocate, from funds appropriated, the sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to the Division of Public Health to provide incentives to local health departments through the Public Health Improvement Incentive Program.

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SECTION 5. Section 3 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2011. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.

SECTION 4. The Program Evaluation Division of the General Assembly shall

study the feasibility of the transfer of all functions, powers, duties, and obligations vested in the

Division of Public Health in the Department of Health and Human Services to the University of

North Carolina Healthcare System and submit its findings and recommendations to the Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee and the Joint Legislative Oversight

Committee on Health and Human Services no later than February 1, 2012.
