23	SECTION 2. The Judicial Department, Office of Indigent Defense Services, shall		
24	use available funds during the 2011-2013 biennium for the expansion of existing public		
25	defender offices providing legal services to the indigent population under the oversight of the		
26	Office of Indigent Defense Services and for the creation of new public defender offices		

27 established by Section 1 of this act. These funds may be used for salaries, benefits, equipment, and related expenses. SECTION 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 2012. 28

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
