8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

9 SECTION 1. The Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee shall 10 include in the 2014-2015 Work Plan for the Program Evaluation Division of the General 11 Assembly a study of the benefits that may result from the merger of public water systems and 12 wastewater collection and treatment works. The Program Evaluation Division shall specifically 13 include the following in the study:

- 14(1)Consideration of whether the benefits that have resulted from the merger of15certain public water systems and certain wastewater collection and treatment16works can be replicated for other systems. In considering this issue, the17Program Evaluation Division shall investigate the performance of the18Charlotte-Mecklenburg Utility Department, the Cape Fear Public Utility19Authority, and Two Rivers Utilities.
 - (2) Whether the State can incentivize public water systems and wastewater collection and treatment works that provide service that is affordable, reliable, and compliant with all applicable laws to purchase, interconnect with, or enter into joint management agreements with public water systems and wastewater collection and treatment works that do not provide service that is affordable, reliable, and compliant with all applicable laws.
- 26 (3) Whether the State can allow public water systems and wastewater collection 27 and treatment works that provide service that is affordable, reliable, and compliant with all applicable laws to apply for grant funding or other 28 29 assistance on the behalf of public water systems and wastewater collection and treatment works that do not provide service that is affordable, reliable, 30 and compliant with all applicable laws if the award of such funding is 31 32 contingent on purchase, interconnection, or a joint management agreement 33 between the systems.

34 **SECTION 2.** The Program Evaluation Division shall submit its findings and 35 recommendations to the Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee and the
