A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF RECIPIENTS OF HARD COPIES OF THE APPELLATE DIVISION REPORTS DISTRIBUTED AT STATE EXPENSE, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION'S COMMITTEE ON JUDICIAL EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 7A-343.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-343.1. Distribution of copies of the appellate division reports.

(a) The Administrative Officer of the Courts shall, at the State's expense distribute such number of copies of the appellate division reports to federal, State departments and agencies, and other named entities and to educational institutions of instruction, as follows:

2 The Administrative Officer of the Courts shall develop a process through which all other
3 persons or entities may obtain copies of the appellate division reports by purchase. The
4 purchase price shall represent the actual cost to the State of publication and shipping.

5 Each justice of the Supreme Court and judge of the Court of Appeals shall receive for
6 private use, one complete and up-to-date set of the appellate division reports. The copies of
7 reports furnished each justice or judge as set out in the table above may be retained personally
8 to enable the justice or judge to keep up-to-date the personal set of reports.

9 (b) The appellate division reports shall be made available by electronic means, at no
10 cost to the recipient, through publication in a downloadable format on a publicly available Web
11 site."

12 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
