A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO RESTORE THE FULL EARLY VOTING PERIOD.

3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 163-227.2(b) reads as rewritten:

5 Not earlier than (i) the third Thursday before the general election in even-numbered "(b) 6 years and the first primary election in even-numbered years or (ii) the second Thursday before 7 an-any other primary or election, in which absentee ballots are authorized, in which a voter 8 seeks to vote and not later than 1:00 P.M. on the last Saturday before that election, the voter 9 shall appear in person only at the office of the county board of elections, provided in subsection 10 (g) of this section. A county board of elections shall conduct one-stop voting on the last 11 Saturday before the election until 1:00 P.M. That voter shall enter the voting enclosure at the 12 board office through the appropriate entrance and shall at once state his or her name and place 13 of residence to an authorized member or employee of the board. In a primary election, the voter 14 shall also state the political party with which the voter affiliates and in whose primary the voter 15 desires to vote, or if the voter is an unaffiliated voter permitted to vote in the primary of a particular party under G.S. 163-119, the voter shall state the name of the authorizing political 16 17 party in whose primary he wishes to vote. The board member or employee to whom the voter 18 gives this information shall announce the name and residence of the voter in a distinct tone of 19 voice. After examining the registration records, an employee of the board shall state whether 20 the person seeking to vote is duly registered. If the voter is found to be registered that voter 21 may request that the authorized member or employee of the board furnish the voter with an 22 application form as specified in G.S. 163-227. The voter shall complete the application in the 23 presence of the authorized member or employee of the board, and shall deliver the application 24 to that person."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to elections
held on or after September 1, 2014.
