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1	(g) Extracurricular Activities for Students. – The Board of Governors of The University			
2	of North Carolina, in cooperation with the constituent institutions participating in the Program,			
3	shall administer extracurricular activities for participating students. These students shall be			
4	exposed to a range of extracurricular activities while attending their respective universities. The			
5	activities should be geared toward instilling a strong motivation not only to remain in teaching			
6	but to provide leadership for the K-12 public schools of North Carolina.			
7	(h) <u>Rule-Making Authority. – The Authority may adopt rules necessary to implement</u> ,			
8	administer, and enforce the provisions of this section.			
9	(i) Report to the General Assembly. – The Authority shall report no later than			
10	December 1, 2015, and annually thereafter, to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight			
11	Committee regarding the Fund and loans awarded from the Fund."			
12	SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of			
13	Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of two million nine hundred thousand			
14	dollars (\$2,900,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to implement the provisions of this act. It is			
15	the intent of the General Assembly that the sum of five million four hundred thousand dollars			
16	(\$5,400,000) shall be appropriated for the 2015-2016 fiscal year to implement the requirements			
17	of this act. Of these funds:			
18	(1) Two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) shall be used to			
19	provide loans for the 2014-2015 academic year, and five million dollars			
20	(\$5,000,000) shall be used to provide loans for the 2015-2016 academic			
21	year.			
22	(2) One hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year			
23	and one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2015-2016 fiscal			
24	year shall be used for administration of the North Carolina STEM and			
25	Special Education Scholars Program by the State Education Assistance
