A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REQUIRE DISCLOSURE OF ESTABLISHMENT OF A FEDERAL
CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE AND TO REQUIRE DISCLOSURE OF CERTAIN
SOLICITATIONS BY LEGISLATORS AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL OF
STATE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 163-278.9 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(l) When filed by a candidate campaign committee as defined in G.S. 163-278.38Z for a legislator or member of the Council of State, each of the reports required by this section shall also disclose if the legislator or member of the Council of State has established a campaign committee under federal law. If the legislator or member of the Council of State has established a campaign committee under federal law, the report shall also disclose if the federal campaign committee has solicited or accepted a contribution from a registered lobbyist or lobbyist principal while the General Assembly was in regular session, as defined in G.S. 163-278.13B(a)(3)."

SECTION 2. G.S. 138A-22 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(h) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a legislator or a public servant, as defined in G.S. 138A-3(30)a., shall supplement the filing of the statement of economic interest on a monthly basis while the General Assembly is in session if the legislator or public servant has established a federal campaign committee. The supplemental filing shall disclose any solicitation of or acceptance of contributions from a registered lobbyist or lobbyist principal, if any."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.



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
