The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
SECTION 1. G.S. 106.2 reads as rewritten:	
"§ 106-2. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services established; Board of	of
Agriculture, membership, terms of office, etc.	
(a) <u>Board established.</u> – The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is	is
created and established and shall be under the control of the Commissioner of Agriculture, wit	
the consent and advice of a board to be styled "The Board of Agriculture."	
(b) Membership; qualifications. – The Board of Agriculture shall consist of the	ıe
Commissioner of Agriculture, who shall be ex officio a member and chairman thereof and sha	
preside at all meetings, and of 10 other members from the State at large, so distributed as t	O
reasonably represent the different sections and agriculture of the State. The Commissioner of	<u>of</u>
Agriculture and the members of the Board of Agriculture shall be practical farmers engaged in	n
their profession. In the appointment of the members of the Board the Governor shall also take	
into consideration the different agricultural interests of the State, and shall appoint member	<u>rs</u>
with the following qualifications:	
(1) one One member who shall be a practical tobacco farmer to represent the	ıe
tobacco farming interest, interest.	
(2) <u>oneOne member</u> who shall be a practical cotton grower to represent the	ıe
cotton interest, interest.	
(3) -oneOne member who shall be a practical truck farmer or general farmer t	О
represent the truck and general farming interest, interest.	
(4) one One member who shall be a practical dairy farmer to represent the dair	y
and livestock interest of the State, State.	
(5) one One member who shall be a practical poultryman to represent the	ie
poultry interest of the State, State.	
(6) -oneOne member who shall be a practical peanut grower to represent the	ıe
peanut interests, interests of the State.  (7) - one One member who shall be experienced in marketing to represent the	16
(7) -oneOne member who shall be experienced in marketing to represent the marketing of products of the State.	ıÜ
(8) One member who shall be actively involved in forestry to represent the	<u>1e</u>



forestry interests of the State.

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One member who shall be actively involved in the nursery business to **(9)** represent the nursery industry of the State.

Terms; vacancies. – The members of such Board shall be appointed by the Governor (c) by and with the consent of the Senate, when the terms of the incumbents respectively expire. The term of office of such members shall be six years and until their successors are duly appointed and qualified. The terms of office of the five members constituting the present Board of Agriculture shall continue for the time for which they were appointed. In making appointments for the enlarged Board of Agriculture, the Governor shall make the appointments so that the term of three members will be for two years, three for four and four for six years. Thereafter the appointments shall be made for six years. Vacancies in such Board shall be filled by the Governor for the unexpired term. The Commissioner of Agriculture and the members of the Board of Agriculture shall be practical farmers engaged in their profession."

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2013, and applies to appointments to the Board of Agriculture made on or after that date.

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
