1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT ALL CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES, JUVENILE 3 FACILITIES, AND LOCAL CONFINEMENT FACILITIES IN THIS STATE SHALL COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL PRISON RAPE 4 5 ELIMINATION ACT (PREA).

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 2 of Chapter 148 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 148-25.1. Compliance with the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act.

All correctional facilities in the State prison system shall be in compliance with the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA), Public Law 108-79."

SECTION 2. Subpart C of Part 3 of Article 13 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 143B-822. Compliance with the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act.

All juvenile facilities in the State shall be in compliance with the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA), Public Law 108-79."

SECTION 3. G.S. 153A-216 reads as rewritten:

"§ 153A-216. Legislative policy.

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The policy of the General Assembly with respect to local confinement facilities is:

- Local confinement facilities should provide secure custody of persons confined therein in order to protect the community and should be operated so as to protect the health and welfare of prisoners and provide for their humane treatment. Local confinement facilities shall also comply with the provisions of the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA), Public Law 108-79.
- (2) Minimum statewide standards should be provided to guide and assist local governments in planning, constructing, and maintaining confinement facilities and in developing programs that provide for humane treatment of prisoners and contribute to the rehabilitation of offenders.
- The State should provide services to local governments to help improve the (3) quality of administration and local confinement facilities. These services should include inspection, consultation, technical assistance, and other appropriate services.
- Adequate qualifications and training of the personnel of local confinement (4) facilities are essential to improving the quality of these facilities. The State
