A HOUSE RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA'S RIGHT TO CLAIM SOVEREIGNTY OVER CERTAIN POWERS UNDER THE TENTH AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES.

4 Whereas, the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads as 5 follows: "The powers not delegated to the United States by the constitution, nor prohibited by it 6 to the states, are reserved to the states, respectively, or to the people;" and

Whereas, the Tenth Amendment defines the total scope of federal power as beingthat specifically granted by the Constitution of the United States and no more; and

9 Whereas, the scope of power defined by the Tenth Amendment means that the 10 federal government was created by the states specifically to be an agent of the states; and

Whereas, today, in 2013, the states are demonstrably treated as agents of the federalgovernment; and

Whereas, many federal mandates are directly in violation of the Tenth Amendmentto the Constitution of the United States; and

Whereas, Section 4 of Article IV of the Constitution of the United States says, "The United States shall guarantee to every state in this union a republican form of government," and the Ninth Amendment states that, "The enumeration in the constitution of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people;" and

Whereas, the United States Supreme Court ruled in <u>New York v. United States</u>, 112
S. Ct. 2408 (1992), that Congress may not simply commandeer the legislative and regulatory
processes of the states; and

Whereas, a number of proposals from previous administrations and some now pending from the present administration and from Congress may further violate the Constitution of the United States; Now, therefore,

25 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

SECTION 1. The North Carolina House of Representatives fully supports the Constitution of the United States and believes the State should have the right to claim sovereignty under the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States over all powers not otherwise enumerated and granted to the federal government or reserved to the people by the Constitution of the United States.

31 **SECTION 3.** The North Carolina House of Representatives urges the federal 32 government, as the agent of the State, to cease and desist, effective immediately, mandates that 33 are beyond the scope of any constitutionally delegated powers.

34 **SECTION 4.** The North Carolina House of Representatives further urges that 35 compulsory federal legislation which directs states to comply under threat of civil or criminal

1	penalties or sanctions or requires states to pass legislation or lose federal funding be prohibited
2	or repealed.
3	SECTION 5. The Principal Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this resolution

- 5 the United States House of Representatives, and each member of the North Carolina6 Congressional Delegation.
 - **SECTION 6.** This resolution is effective upon adoption.
