& \text { USE IN LIFE-THREATENING AND EMERGENCY SITUATIONS. } \\
& \text { The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: } \\
& \text { SECTION 1. The Department of Public Instruction shall study and develop } \\
& \text { recommendations on whether the use of certain safety measures, including silent, panic alarm } \\
& \text { systems, are necessary in each school in North Carolina to increase the safety of students and to } \\
& \text { adequately respond to life-threatening and emergency situations in the public schools. In } \\
& \text { developing its recommendations, the Department shall consider at least all of the following } \\
& \text { issues: } \\
& \text { (1) The feasibility and cost of installing silent, panic alarm systems or other } \\
& \text { (2) } \begin{array}{l}
\text { Development of standardized training for school personnel and safety } \\
\text { (3) } \text { protocols for implementation throughout the State. } \\
\text { (4) } \begin{array}{l}
\text { Stataboration with local law enforcement agencies and other appropriate } \\
\text { The effectiveness and costs of programs in other states that employ a variety } \\
\text { of safety measures in schools, including states that provide for the } \\
\text { installation of silent, panic alarm systems. }

\text { SECTION 2. The Department of Public Instruction shall report its findings and } \\
\text { recommendations from the study required by Section } 1 \text { of this act to the Joint Legislative } \\
\text { Education Oversight Committee on or before January 1, 2014. }
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SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
