**HOUSE BILL 805** Short Title: Ban Smoking in Foster Care Setting/Infants. (Public) Sponsors: Representatives Cotham and Jackson (Primary Sponsors). April 11, 2013 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SOCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION TO ADOPT A POLICY PROHIBITING A FOSTER PARENT FROM SMOKING IN THE PRESENCE OF AN INFANT IN THE FOSTER PARENT'S CARE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 131D-10.5 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "§ 131D-10.5. Powers and duties of the Commission. In addition to other powers and duties prescribed by law, the Commission shall exercise the following powers and duties: (8) Adopt rules establishing a policy to prohibit a foster parent from smoking in the presence of an infant in the foster parent's care pursuant to G.S. 131D-10.9A." **SECTION 2.** Article 1A of Chapter 131D of the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new section to read: "§ 131D-10.9A. Policy prohibiting smoking in the presence of an infant in foster care setting. For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply: (a) Infant. – A young child less than one year of age. (1) Smoking. – As defined in G.S. 143-596(5). (2) Pursuant to rules adopted by the Commission under G.S. 131D-10.5(8), the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Social Services, shall enforce a written policy prohibiting a foster parent from smoking in a private residence used to provide licensed foster care on the premises. The policy shall further prohibit a foster parent from smoking in the presence of an infant in the foster parent's care while the infant and the foster parent are in a motor vehicle. The policy shall require a foster parent to prohibit others from smoking in the

presence of an infant in that foster parent's care."
