1 2 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 3 AN ACT TO REPEAL UNNECESSARY STATUTES. MAKE CONFORMING CHANGES 4 TO THE GENERAL STATUTES, AND CLARIFY OPERATION AND OVERSIGHT OF 5 CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS FORMERLY GOVERNED BY THE 6 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES. 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 8 SECTION 1.(a) G.S.115C-383 is repealed. SECTION 1.(b) Part 9A of Article 3 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is 9 10 repealed. 11 SECTION 1.(c) Part 30 of Article 3 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is 12 repealed. 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 14 Article to read: 15 "Article 9C. "Schools for Students with Visual and Hearing Impairments. 16 "§ 115C-150.11. State Board of Education as governing agency. 17 The State Board of Education shall be the sole governing agency for the Governor 18 Morehead School for the Blind, the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf, and the North 19 20 Carolina School for the Deaf. The Department of Public Instruction shall be responsible for the administration and oversight of a school governed by this Article. 21 "§ 115C-150.12. Applicability of Chapter. 22 23 Except as otherwise provided, the requirements of this Chapter shall apply to the schools governed by this Article. 24 "<u>§ 115C-150.13. Rule making.</u> 25 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules necessary for the Department of 26 (a) Public Instruction to implement this Article, including, at a minimum, rules to address 27 eligibility for admission criteria. In determining rules for admission criteria, the State Board of 28 29 Education shall take into account the following factors: State and federal laws. 30 (1)Optimal academic and communicative outcomes for the child. 31 (2)32 Parental input and choice. (3) 33 (4) Recommendations in a child's Individualized Education Program (IEP). Rules shall be adopted in accordance with Chapter 150B of the General Statutes. 34 (b)

SECTION 6. G.S. 143B-146.8(f) reads as rewritten:

4 "(f) Evaluation of Principals. - Each year the Secretary or the Superintendent shall 5 evaluate the principals."

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SECTION 7. G.S. 143B-146.15 reads as rewritten:

"§ 143B-146.15. Duty to report certain acts to law enforcement.

8 When the principal has personal knowledge or actual notice from residential school 9 personnel or other reliable source that an act has occurred on school property involving assault 10 resulting in serious personal injury, sexual assault, sexual offense, rape, kidnapping, indecent 11 liberties with a minor, assault involving the use of a weapon, possession of a firearm in 12 violation of the law, possession of a weapon in violation of the law, or possession of a 13 controlled substance in violation of the law, the principal shall immediately report the act to the 14 appropriate local law enforcement agency. Failure to report under this section is a Class 3 15 misdemeanor. For purposes of this section, "school property" shall include any building, bus, 16 campus, grounds, recreational area, or athletic field, in the charge of the principal or while the 17 student is under the supervision of school personnel. It is the intent of the General Assembly 18 that the principal notify the Secretary-or the Superintendent of any report made to law 19 enforcement under this section."

SECTION 8. G.S. 143B-146.21 reads as rewritten:

"§ 143B-146.21. Policies, reports, and other miscellaneous provisions.

22 (a) The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall consult with the State Board of 23 Education in its implementation of this act as it pertains to improving the educational programs 24 at the residential schools. The Secretary also shall fully inform and consult with the chairs of 25 the Appropriations Subcommittees on Education and Health and Human Services of the Senate 26 and the House of Representatives on a regular basis as the Secretary carries out his duties under this act. 27

28 <del>(b)</del> The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall adopt policies and offer training 29 opportunities to ensure that personnel who provide direct services to children in the State 30 schools for the deaf become proficient in sign language within two years of their initial date of 31 employment or within two years of the effective date of this act, whichever occurs later. This 32 subsection shall not apply to preschool personnel in any oral, auditory, or cued speech 33 preschool.

34 The Department of Public Instruction, the Board of Governors of The University of (c) 35 North Carolina, and the State Board of Community Colleges shall offer and communicate the 36 availability of professional development opportunities, including those to improve sign 37 language skills, opportunities to the personnel assigned to the State's residential schools, 38 particularly the Governor Morehead School and the schools for the deaf.schools.

39 The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall adopt policies to ensure that (d) 40 students of the residential schools are given priority to residing in the independent living 41 facilities on each school's campus.

42 The Secretary of Health and Human Services, in consultation with the Office of (e) 43 State Personnel, shall set the salary supplement paid to teachers, instructional support personnel, and school-based administrators who are employed in the programs operated by the 44 45 Department of Health and Human Services and are licensed by the State Board of Education. 46 The salary supplement shall be at least five percent (5%), but not more than the percentage 47 supplement they would receive if they were employed in the local school administrative unit 48 where the job site is located. These salary supplements shall not be paid to central office staff. 49 Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to include "merit pay" under the term "salary 50 supplement"."

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**SECTION 9.** Unless inconsistent with the provisions of Article 9C of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes, as enacted by Section 2 of this act, the rules adopted pursuant to former Part 9A or Part 30 of Article 3, or any other statutory provisions of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes, prior to amendment by this act, governing the Governor Morehead School, the North Carolina School for the Deaf, and the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf shall remain in effect until superseded by rules adopted under Article 9C of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes, as enacted by Section 2 of this act.

8 **SECTION 10.** Notwithstanding G.S. 143C-6-4, the Department of Public 9 Instruction may reorganize, if necessary, staffing of the Governor Morehead School, the North 10 Carolina School for the Deaf, and the Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf to meet 11 needed functions.

**SECTION 11.(a)** Notwithstanding Section 10.21A of S.L. 2010-31 and G.S. 115C-150.11, as enacted by this act, the Department of Health and Human Services shall continue to be responsible for the maintenance and repair of all buildings, grounds, and facilities of the Governor Morehead School and for providing utilities for the Governor Morehead School, provided that the Department of Health and Human Services may enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Department of Public Instruction for the Department of Public Instruction to assume any of those responsibilities.

**SECTION 11.(b)** Notwithstanding Section 10.21A of S.L. 2010-31 and G.S. 115C-150.11, as enacted by this act, the Department of Health and Human Services shall continue to be responsible for information technology support for Eastern North Carolina School for the Deaf, the North Carolina School for the Deaf, and the Governor Morehead School, provided the Department of Health and Human Services may enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Department of Public Instruction for the Department of Public Instruction to assume any of those responsibilities.

SECTION 12.(a) The Department of Public Instruction shall study and develop recommendations on educational options, including residential services, for students with visual and hearing impairments. The Department of Public Instruction shall report its findings and recommendations from the study to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on or before January 1, 2014.

31 **SECTION 12.(b)** Prior to the initial adoption of rules required by Section 2 of this 32 act, the Department of Public Instruction and the State Board of Education shall present a draft 33 of the proposed rules to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on or before 34 January 1, 2014.

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**SECTION 13.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
