## 1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE REPEAL OF PORTIONS OF 2 THE PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT AND THE HEALTH 3 CARE AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT.

4 Whereas, sections 9010 and 10905 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care 5 Act (P.L. 111-148) and section 1406 of the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act (P.L. 6 111-152) impose an unprecedented new tax on health insurance that numerous policy experts 7 agree will be passed on to individuals, working families, small employers, and senior citizens, 8 contradicting a primary goal of health reform by making care more expensive; and

9 Whereas, the health insurance tax will cause premiums on the individual market to rise an average of \$2,150 for individuals and \$5,080 for families nationally over a 10-year 10 11 period; and 12

Whereas, the tax will impose a fee of \$400 on North Carolina families in 2016; and

Whereas, the health insurance tax will impact small employers over the next 10 13 years, reducing private sector jobs by 125,000, with 59% at small businesses, and potential 14 15 sales will be reduced by at least \$18 billion, 50% of which will come from small businesses; 16 and

17 Whereas, in the State of North Carolina, premiums for small employers will increase by an average of \$500 per employee, and premiums for large employers will also 18 19 increase; and

20 Whereas, North Carolinians with a Medicare Advantage Plan would see an 21 increased cost in additional premiums and reduced benefits over 10 years; and

Whereas, an increase in North Carolina's Medicaid health plan would place pressure 22 23 on an already strained State budget, decreasing benefits and potentially creating coverage 24 disruption; and

25 Whereas, higher premiums are a disincentive for everyone to obtain insurance coverage, particularly younger, healthier people who are likely to drop their policy if it 26 27 becomes too expensive, further eroding the risk pool and making coverage less affordable, 28 Now, therefore,

29 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

SECTION 1. That the House of Representatives strongly urges the United States 30 Congress to enact legislation to repeal the health insurance tax, sections 9010 and 10905 of the 31 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, and section 1406 of the Health Care and Education 32 33 Reconciliation Act to make health care more affordable for working families, individuals, and 34 businesses.
