2	AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES,		
3	DIVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, ANI		
4	SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES, TO DEVELOP AND ESTABLISH A STATEWIDE		
5	TELEPSYCHIATRY PROGRAM.		
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
7	SECTION 1. By no later than June 1, 2013, the Department of Health and Human		
8	Services, Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse		
9	Services, shall develop and submit a plan for implementation of a statewide telepsychiatry		
10	program to the Senate Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the House		
11	Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and the Joint Legislative		
12	Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services. The plan shall be substantially similar to		
13	the Albemarle Hospital Foundation telepsychiatry program currently operating in 12 hospitals		
14	in eastern North Carolina and include at least all of the following:		
15	(1) Specific steps to be taken by the Department, within a specified time period,		
16	to establish and administer the program statewide.		
17	(2) Program costs and rates of payment for telepsychiatry services.		
18	(3) Recommendations for addressing liability issues related to participation in		
19	telepsychiatry.		
20	SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department		
21	Health and Human Services, Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and		
22	Substance Abuse Services, the sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the 2013-2014 fiscal		
23	year and the sum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year. These funds		
24 25	shall be used for the following purposes:		
23 24 25 26	(1) To establish and administer the statewide telepsychiatry program authorized in C_{1} S = 122C 20.5 of the Converse Statement		
26	in G.S. 122C-20.5 of the General Statutes.		
27	(2) To purchase needed telepsychiatry equipment for State-owned hospitals		
28 29	(3) participating in the statewide telepsychiatry program.(3) To contract with an outside vendor for management of the statewide		
29 30	(5) To contract with an outside vendor for management of the statewide telepsychiatry program.		
30 31	SECTION 3. Chapter 122C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new

35	"§ 122C-20.5. Department to establish statewide telepsychiatry program.		
36	(a) The following definitions apply in this section:		



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1	<u>(1)</u>	Consultant Site The site at which the consulting provider is physically	
2		located at the time the consulting provider delivers the acute mental health or	
3		substance abuse care by means of telepsychiatry.	
4	<u>(2)</u>	Referring site The emergency department at which the patient is	
5		physically located.	
6	<u>(3)</u>	<u>Telepsychiatry. – The delivery of acute mental health or substance abuse</u>	
7		care, including diagnosis or treatment, by means of two-way real-time	
8		interactive audio or video by a consulting provider at a consultant site to an	
9		individual patient at a referring site. The term does not include the standard	
10		use of telephones, facsimile transmissions, unsecured electronic mail, or a	
11		combination of these in the course of care.	
12	<u>(4)</u>	Consulting provider A physician or other health care provider licensed in	
13		this State to provide acute mental health or substance abuse care.	
14	<u>(b)</u> <u>The</u>	Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse	
15	Services shall establish a statewide telepsychiatry program that allows referring sites to utilize		
16	consulting providers at a consultant site to provide timely psychiatric assessment and rapid		
17	initiation of treatment for patients at the referring site experiencing an acute mental health or		
18	substance abuse crisis.		
19		Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement this section. The rules	
20		least all of the following:	
21	<u>(1)</u>	Requirements to ensure the health and safety of patients.	
22	<u>(2)</u>	Participation and equipment requirements for consultant sites, consulting	
23		providers, and referring sites.	
24	<u>(3)</u>	Rates of payment for telepsychiatry services.	
25		Department shall periodically evaluate the effectiveness of the statewide	
26	telepsychiatry program."		
27		CTION 4. Section 2 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2013. Section 3 of this	
28	act becomes effective January 1, 2014. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes		
29	law.
