33	<u>(</u> 2	2) The student is enrolled or accepted for enrollment on a full-time basis	in an

1	(3) The student has complied with the registration requirements of the M	<u>Ailitary</u>
2 3	Selective Service Act or is exempt from the registration requirements.	
	(d) Administration. – The State grants provided for in this section shall be admir	nistered
4	by the Authority pursuant to rules adopted by the Authority not inconsistent with this s	section.
5	The Authority shall pay the State grant to each student eligible under this section. The	amount
6	of the grant for each student shall be eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) per academic ye	ar. The
7	grant shall be paid directly to the student on or after July 1 following the completion	of the
8	academic year. The Authority shall not remit any grant until it receives proper certif	fication
9	from an institution that the student applying for the grant is an eligible student.	
10	(e) Shortfall. – In the event there are not sufficient funds to provide each of	
11	student with a full grant, each eligible student shall receive a pro rata share of funds	
12	grant then available for the appropriate academic year within the fiscal period covered	by the
13	current appropriation.	
14	(f) Reversion. – Any remaining funds shall revert to the General Fund.	
15	(g) Student enrollment documented. – The Authority shall document the num	
16	eligible students that are enrolled in approved institutions and the State funds collect	
17	students at each approved institution under this section. The Authority shall report	
18	findings to the Senate and House of Representatives Appropriations Subcommitt	ees on
19	Education and the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee."	
20	<b>SECTION 2.</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Ed	
21	Assistance Authority the sum of eight hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$825,000)	
22	2013-2014 fiscal year and the sum of eight hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$82	
23	for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to fund the North Carolina Optometry Education Grant P	rogram
24	established in G.S. 116-290, as enacted by Section 1 of this act.	
25	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2013, and applies	to the
26	2013-2014 academic year and each subsequent academic year.
