General Assembly of North Carolina Session 2013 1 Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a person who comes to an animal (c) 2 shelter attempting to locate a lost pet is entitled to view every animal held at the shelter, subject 3 to rules providing for such viewing during at least four hours a day, three days a week. If the 4 shelter is housing animals that must be kept apart from the general public for health reasons, 5 public safety concerns, or in order to preserve evidence for criminal proceedings, the shelter 6 shall make reasonable arrangements that allow pet owners to determine whether their lost pets 7 are among those animals. 8 During the minimum holding period, an animal shelter may place an animal it is (d) 9 holding into foster care by transferring possession of the animal to an approved foster care 10 provider, an approved rescue organization, or the person who found the animal. If an animal 11 shelter transfers possession of an animal under this subsection, at least one photograph 12 depicting the head and face of the animal shall be displayed at the shelter in a conspicuous 13 location that is available to the general public during hours of operation, and that photograph 14 shall remain posted until the animal is disposed of as provided in subsection (f) of this section. If a shelter places an animal in foster care, the shelter may, in writing, appoint the 15 (e) 16 person or organization possessing of the animal to be an agent of the shelter. After the 17 expiration of the minimum holding period, the shelter may (i) direct the agent possessing the 18 animal to return it to the shelter, (ii) allow the agent to adopt the animal consistent with the 19 shelter's adoption policies, or (iii) extend the period of time that the agent holds the animal on 20 behalf of the shelter. A shelter may terminate an agency created under this subsection at any 21 time by directing the agent to deliver the animal to the shelter. The local government or 22 organization operating the shelter, as principal in the agency relationship, shall not be liable to 23 reimburse the agent for the costs of care of the animal and shall not be liable to the owner of the 24 animal for harm to the animal caused by the agent, absent a written contract providing 25 otherwise. 26 (f) An animal that is surrendered to an animal shelter by the animal's owner and not 27 reclaimed by that owner during the minimum holding period may be disposed of in one of the 28 following manners: 29 (1) Returned to the owner. 30 (2)Adopted as a pet by a new owner. 31 (3) Euthanized by a procedure approved by rules adopted by the Department of 32 Agriculture and Consumer Services or, in the absence of such rules, by a 33 procedure approved by the American Veterinary Medical Association, the 34 Humane Society of the United States, or the American Humane Association. 35 An animal that is surrendered to an animal shelter by the animal's owner may be (g) 36 disposed of before the expiration of the minimum holding period in a manner authorized under 37 subsection (f) of this section if the owner provides to the shelter (i) some proof of ownership of 38 the animal and (ii) a signed written consent to the disposition of the animal before the 39 expiration of the minimum holding period. 40 An animal shelter shall require every person to whom an animal is released to (h) 41 present one of the following valid forms of government-issued photographic identification: (i) a 42 drivers license, (ii) a special identification card issued under G.S. 20-37.7, (iii) a military 43 identification card, or (iv) a passport. Upon presentation of the required photographic 44 identification, the shelter shall document the name of the person, the type of photographic 45 identification presented by the person, and the photographic identification number. Animal shelters shall maintain a record of all animals impounded at the shelter, shall 46 (i) 47 retain those records for a period of at least three years from the date of impoundment, and shall 48 make those records available for inspection during regular inspections pursuant to this Article 49 or upon the request of a representative of the Animal Welfare Section. These records shall 50 contain, at a minimum:
