#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 2 AN ACT TO RECODIFY AND AMEND THE EXISTING LAW ENACTED TO ASSIST 3 OWNERS IN RECOVERING LOST PETS, RELIEVE OVERCROWDING AT ANIMAL 4 SHELTERS, FACILITATE ADOPTIONS FROM ANIMAL SHELTERS, AND TO 5 PROVIDE FOR IMPROVED ENFORCEMENT OF THAT LAW BY MAKING IT PART 6 OF THE ANIMAL WELFARE ACT; AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP ON THE 7 AMOUNT AVAILABLE FROM REIMBURSEMENT THE SPAY/NEUTER 8 PROGRAM. 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 10 SECTION 1. G.S. 19A-23 is amended by redesignating subdivision (5a) as subdivision (5c) and by adding two new subdivisions to read: 11 12 "(5a) "Approved foster care provider" means an individual, nonprofit corporation, or association that cares for stray animals that has been favorably assessed 13 by the operator of the animal shelter through the application of written 14 15 standards. "Approved rescue organization" means a nonprofit corporation or 16 (5b) association that cares for stray animals that has been favorably assessed by 17 the operator of the animal shelter through the application of written 18 19 standards." 20 SECTION 2. Chapter 19A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 21 section to read: 22 "§ 19A-32.1. Minimum holding period for animals in animal shelters; public viewing of animals in animal shelters: disposition of animals. 23 Except as otherwise provided in this section, all animals received by an animal 24 (a) 25 shelter or by an agent of an animal shelter shall be held for a minimum holding period of 72 hours, or for any longer minimum period established by a board of county commissioners, prior 26 27 to being euthanized or otherwise disposed of. 28 Before an animal may be euthanized or otherwise disposed of, it shall be made (b) available for adoption under procedures that enable members of the public to inspect the 29 animal, except in the following cases: 30 31 The animal has been found by the operator of the shelter to be unadoptable (1)32 due to injury or defects of health or temperament.

#### SECTION 4. G.S. 19A-64 reads as rewritten:

## 6 "§ 19A-64. Distributions to counties and cities from Spay/Neuter Account.

7 Reimbursable Costs. - Counties and cities eligible for distributions from the (a) 8 Spay/Neuter Account may receive reimbursement for the direct costs of a spay/neuter surgical 9 procedure for a dog or cat owned by a low-income person as defined in G.S. 19A-63(b). 10 Reimbursable costs shall include anesthesia, medication, and veterinary services. Counties and 11 cities shall not be reimbursed for the administrative costs of providing reduced-cost spay/neuter services or capital expenditures for facilities and equipment associated with the provision of 12 13 such services. The reimbursement amount for each surgical procedure for a female dog or cat 14 shall be no more than one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the average reimbursement allowed for surgical procedures for female dogs and cats by the Spay/Neuter Program during the prior 15 16 calendar year. The reimbursement amount for each surgical procedure for a male dog or cat 17 shall be no more than one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the average reimbursement allowed 18 for surgical procedures for male dogs and cats by the Spay/Neuter Program during the prior 19 calendar year.

(b) Application. – A county or city eligible for reimbursement of spaying and neutering
costs from the Spay/Neuter Account shall apply to the Department of Agriculture and
Consumer Services by the last day of January, April, July, and October of each year to receive
a distribution from the Account for that quarter. The application shall be submitted in the form
required by the Department and shall include an itemized listing of the costs for which
reimbursement is sought.

(c) Distribution. – The Department shall make payments from the Spay/Neuter Account
 to eligible counties and cities who have made timely application for reimbursement within 30
 days of the closing date for receipt of applications for that quarter. In the event that total
 requests for reimbursement exceed the amounts available in the Spay/Neuter Account for
 distribution, the monies available will be distributed as follows:
