Parental Notification Regarding Rights to Student Records and Opt-Out 34 Opportunities. 35 Annual Parental Notification. – Local boards of education shall annually provide (a) parents, by a method reasonably designed to provide actual notice, information on parental 36 rights under State and federal law with regards to student records and opt-out opportunities for 37 38 disclosure of directory information as provided under the Family Educational Rights and 39 Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, and notice and opt-out opportunities for surveys covered by 40 the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment, 20 U.S.C. § 1232h. 41 Notice Content. – The notice shall include information on parental rights under 42 State and federal law to: 43 (1) Inspect and review education records. 44 (2) Seek to amend inaccurate education records. 45 Provide written consent prior to disclosure of personally identifiable (3) information from education records, except as otherwise provided by law. 46 47 Information shall be included on disclosure of directory information and 48 parental rights to opt out of disclosure of directory information.

## **PART III: EFFECTIVE DATE**

**SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law. Annual notice requirements to parents required by Section 2 apply beginning with the 2014-2015 school year.
