4	<b>SECTION 2.</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
5	Public Instruction the sum of three hundred forty-three thousand seven hundred twenty-two
6	dollars (\$343,722) in recurring funds for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to provide NBPTS bonuses
7	to teachers with NBPTS certification who are employed for at least seventy percent (70%) of
8	their work time as instructional coaches in Title I schools.
9	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2014.
