A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF MORRISVILLE TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN TO IMPOSE AND COLLECT A ROAD PROJECT FEE ON ALL NEW CONSTRUCTION WITHIN THE TOWN'S CORPORATE LIMITS AND EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. The Charter of the Town of Morrisville, being Chapter 776 of the 1947
Session Laws, as amended by Chapter 640 of the 1949 Session Laws and Chapter 802 of the 1975
Session Laws, is amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

10 "Sec. 11A. The Town of Morrisville shall have the right, power, and authority to impose and collect a regulatory or development fee defined as a road project fee on all new construction 11 12 within the Town limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction. It is the purpose and intent of this section 13 to provide the Town with the legal mechanism granting it the right, power, and authority to impose and collect fees to finance additional improvements within the Town limits and 14 extraterritorial jurisdiction. These additional road improvements are being caused by rapid and 15 continued growth within the Morrisville area. This section provides approval to the Town to 16 actually develop and implement such a fee system but does not in any way describe or detail the 17 18 actual fee structure and rate classification. An extensive study will subsequently be performed to establish the basis and framework for the fee system should the system be deemed necessary in 19 20 order to maintain the high level of service delivery presently available to Morrisville residents."

21 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
