BARTLETT. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 163 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 6 Article to read: 7 "Article 12B. 8 "Redistricting. 9 "§ 163-133. Definitions. 10 As used in this Article, the following definitions apply: 11 Ideal population. - The number determined by dividing the number of (1) 12 members in a plan into the population of the State as reported in the federal 13 census. 14 Majority-minority district. – A district in which minorities make up more (2) 15 than fifty percent (50%) of the voting age population in the relevant geographic area. 16 Sufficient population. – A population that is within five percent (5%) of the 17 (3) 18 ideal population for that district. 19 <u>(4)</u> Voting Rights Act district. – A majority-minority district that must be created to comply with section 2 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965. 20 21 Whole County Provision. - The requirement in Article II, Section 3(3) and **(5)** 22 Article II, Section 5(3) of the North Carolina Constitution that no county be 23 divided in the formation of legislative districts. "§ 163-134. Redistricting principles for legislative districts. 24 25 Purpose. – The purpose of this section is to codify the principles established by the North Carolina Supreme Court in interpreting the requirements of the North Carolina 26 27 Constitution for the drawing of State legislative districts. 28

- Requirements for All Districts. The following requirements shall apply to all legislative districts:
 - All legislative districts shall be single-member districts. (1)
 - (2) To meet the requirements of equal representation as required by the equal protection provisions of the United States Constitution, no district may be drawn to encompass a population that is more than five percent (5%) greater than the ideal population or more than five percent (5%) less than the ideal population.
