A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION 3 COMPLIES WITH FEDERAL LAW IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF 21ST CENTURY 4 COMMUNITY LEARNING GRANTS AND DOES NOT EXCEED MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS UNDER FEDERAL LAW IN REGARD TO THE AWARD OF 5 6 TO SUB-GRANTEES; AND TO MODIFY THE **FUNDS** COMPETITIVE 7 AFTER-SCHOOL GRANT PROGRAM. 8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 9 SECTION 1. The Department of Public Instruction shall comply with the 10 requirements of Title IV, Part B of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 11 7171-7176, and any applicable federal regulations, in administering and awarding federal funds 12 to sub-grantees under the 21st Century Community Learning Center Grants federal program. The Department shall also not exceed federal requirements under that program in regard to the 13 14 regulations and limitations applicable to sub-grantees for receipt of those funds. 15 **SECTION 2.(a)** The State Board of Education shall permit existing after-school 16 learning programs for at-risk students to participate and be eligible to receive two-year grants 17 of up to five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) a year under the After-School Quality 18 Improvement Grant Program established pursuant to Section 8.19 of S.L. 2014-100. 19 SECTION 2.(b) All grant recipients under the After-School Quality Improvement 20 Grant Program established pursuant to Section 8.19 of S.L. 2014-100 shall act as their own 21 fiscal agents in regard to the use and reporting requirements for the funds. 22 SECTION 3. Section 2 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2015. The

23 remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
