A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND AND CLARIFY THE POWERS OF WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 162A-6(a)(14c) reads as rewritten:

"(14c) To adopt ordinances concerning any of the following:

- <u>a.</u> <u>to regulate The regulation</u> and control <u>of the discharge of sewage or stormwater into any sewerage system owned or operated by the <u>authority, authority.</u></u>
- <u>b.</u> The regulation and control of a water system owned or operated by the authority.
- <u>c.</u> <u>to adopt ordinances concerning stormwater Stormwater management</u> programs designed to protect water quality by controlling the level of pollutants in and the quantity and flow of <u>stormwater</u>, <u>stormwater</u>.
- <u>d.</u> and to adopt ordinances to regulate The regulation and control of structural and natural stormwater and drainage systems of all types.

Prior to the adoption of any such ordinance or any amendment to any such ordinance, the authority shall first pass a declaration of intent to adopt such ordinance or amendment. The declaration of intent shall describe the ordinance which it is proposed that the authority adopt. The declaration of intent shall be submitted to each governing body for review and comment. The authority shall consider any comment or suggestions offered by any governing body with respect to the proposed ordinance or amendment. Thereafter, the authority shall be authorized to adopt such ordinance or amendment to it at any time after 60 days following the submission of the declaration of intent to each governing body."

SECTION 2. G.S. 162A-6(a) is amended by adding two new subdivisions to read:

"(17) To enter into reimbursement agreements with private developers and property owners for the design and construction of infrastructure that is included on the authority's capital improvement plan and serves the developer or property owner. An authority shall enact ordinances setting forth procedures and terms under which such agreements may be approved. An authority may provide for such reimbursements to be paid from any lawful source. Reimbursement agreements authorized by this paragraph shall not be subject to Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes, except as provided by this subsection. A developer or property owner who is party to a
