The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 115C-562.1(3) reads as rewritten: Eligible students. – A student who has not yet received a high school diploma and who meets all of the following requirements: Meets one of the following criteria: a. 1. Was a full-time student assigned to and attending a public school pursuant to G.S. 115C-366 during the previous semester. Received a scholarship grant during the previous school year. 2. Is entering either kindergarten or the first grade. 3. 4. Is a child in foster care as defined in G.S. 131D-10.2(9). Is a child whose adoption decree was entered not more than one 5. year prior to submission of the scholarship grant application. Is a child whose parent or legal guardian is on full-time duty <u>6.</u> status in the active uniformed service of the United States, including members of the National Guard and Reserve on active duty orders pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 12301, et seq., and 10 U.S.C. § 12401, et seq. Resides in a household with an income level not in excess of one b. hundred thirty-three percent (133%) of the amount required for the



student to qualify for the federal free or reduced-price lunch program."
