SECTION 1. Article 2 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding		
a new section to read:		
"§ 20-17.1A. Restoration of license for person adjudicated to be restored to competency.

Article for restoration of the person's drivers license." SECTION 2. G.S. 35A-1130(d) reads as rewritten:

"(d) If the clerk or jury finds by a preponderance of the evidence that the ward is competent, the clerk shall enter an order adjudicating that the ward is restored to competency.		
Upon such adjudication, the ward is authorized to manage his or her affairs, make contracts,		
control and sell his or her property, both real and personal, and exercise all rights as if he or she		

had never been adjudicated incompetent. In addition, the clerk shall send a certified copy of the

order adjudicating that the ward is restored to competency to the Division of Motor Vehicles."

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2015.
