13 (1) There is a need for a person to have the freedom to choose the manner, cost,
14 <u>and setting for giving birth.</u> 15 (2) Access to proposel and delivery convices is limited by the inclosure

16number of providers of midwifery services, and the practice of midwifery17may help to reduce this shortage.
