

Tracking and report on permit processing times.

1 The Department of Environmental Quality shall track the time required to process all permit 2 applications in the One-Stop for Certain Environmental Permits Programs established by 3 G.S. 143B-279.12 and the Express Permit and Certification Reviews established by 4 G.S. 143B-279.13 that are received by the Department. The processing time tracked shall include 5 (i) the total processing time from when an initial permit application is received to issuance or 6 denial of the permit and (ii) the processing time from when a complete permit application is 7 received to issuance or denial of the permit. No later than March-January 1 of each odd-numbered 8 year, the Department shall report to the Fiscal Research Division of the General Assembly and the 9 Environmental Review Commission on the permit processing times required to be tracked 10 pursuant to this section.
