#### **BILL SUMMARY**:

Under current law, a brewer producing less than 25,000 barrels may obtain a malt beverage wholesaler permit (in addition to a brewery permit) to sell its products. Brewers producing more than 25,000 barrels must use a separate wholesaler. This bill would allow brewers to obtain a malt beverage wholesaler permit to wholesale their own products up to 100,000 barrels.

#### ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

This bill will not have a fiscal impact on the State. The ABC Commission estimates that fewer than five breweries have the capacity to brew more than 25,000 barrels. There is a \$300 one-time fee for a malt beverage wholesaler permit. To the extent that additional breweries obtain a wholesaler permit, General Fund revenue would increase by \$300 per permit issued.
