BILL SUMMARY:

The bill directs the Division of Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice (DACJJ) to provide mammograms for women age 40 or over that are incarcerated in the North Carolina prison system.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

DACJJ policy mandates mammograms for inmates 50 and over, or if an inmate has a family history that warrants screening before age 50. In FY 2013-14, 37 inmates age 40-49 received a mammogram (5.4% of the total population). There are 660 additional female inmates age 40-49 who would be eligible to receive a mammogram under this proposal. Each mammogram costs \$2,000. So the cost to provide the service in the first year would be \$1,320,000 (660 times \$2,000).

The prison population is projected to decline in future years, and misdemeanants and DWI offenders are no longer sent to State prison. Below is the projected 40-49 population eligible for mammograms.
