#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO MAKE CHANGES TO THE PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICT IN PERSON AND CASWELL COUNTIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.(a)** G.S. 7A-41(a) reads as rewritten:

### "§ 7A-41. Superior court divisions and districts; judges.

(a) The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior court districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular resident superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than a whole county, as set out in subsection (b) of this section:

**SECTION 2.(b)** In order to implement the changes in this section, the District Court judgeships serving District 9A shall be allocated to Judicial District 17A of the General Court of Justice effective January 1, 2019.

**SECTION 2.(c)** In order to implement the changes in this section, the district court judge serving a term from January 1, 2015, to December 31, 2018, in District 9A, notwithstanding G.S. 7A-4.20, may continue to serve until December 31, 2018. No official action performed by that judge of Judicial District 9A of the district court division of the General Court of Justice shall be declared to be invalid by reason of the fact that the judge was beyond the mandatory retirement age set out in G.S. 7A-4.20 at the time of performing any such act; provided, this exception shall only apply to those official actions performed on or before December 31, 2018.

### **SECTION 3.** G.S. 7A-60(a1) reads as rewritten:

## "§ 7A-60. District attorneys and prosecutorial districts.

The State shall be divided into prosecutorial districts, as shown in subsection (a1) of this section. There shall be a district attorney for each prosecutorial district, as provided in subsections (b) and (c) of this section who shall be a resident of the prosecutorial district for which elected. A vacancy in the office of district attorney shall be filled as provided in Article IV, Sec. 19 of the Constitution.
