# AN ACT TO MAKE CHANGES TO THE PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICT IN PERSON AND CASWELL COUNTIES.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.(a)** G.S. 7A-41(a) reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 7A-41. Superior court divisions and districts; judges.

7 (a) The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior court 8 districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular resident 9 superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than a whole 10 county, as set out in subsection (b) of this section:
