AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE LEGISLATIVE STUDY COMMISSION TO STUDY THE		
ISSUE OF REGULATORY BARRIERS IN COASTAL ECONOMIES.		
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
SECTION 1. The Legislative Research Commission shall study the regulatory,		
financial, and infrastructure burdens in coastal communities. For purposes of this study, coastal		
community shall refer to any county in the State containing or to the east of Interstate 95. In its		
study, the Commission may consider the following:		
(1	1) Administrative burdens and increased costs due to unneces	sary or
	duplicative environmental regulations.	
(2	2) Impacts on private property rights and land development due to land	use and
	other restrictions imposed by local governments.	
(3	B) Impacts of underinvestment in necessary infrastructure to encour	age and
	sustain economic development.	
(4	Any other topic or issue relevant to this study.
