5	SECT	TION 1. G.S. 116E-1 reads as rewritten:

7	(1)	"Center" means the Governmental Data Analytics Center as established in		
8		Part 8 of Article 15 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes."Board" means		
9		the governing board of the North Carolina Longitudinal Data System.		
10	(2)	"De-identified data" means a data set in which parent and student identity		
11		information, including the unique student identifier and student social		
12		security number, has been removed.

17	(a) There	is established the North Carolina Longitudinal Data System Board which		
18	shall consist of th	ne following 18 members:		
19	(1)	The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or the Superintendent's designee.		
20	(2)	The President of The University of North Carolina, or the President's		
21		designee.		
22	(3)	The President of the North Carolina Community College System, or the		
23		President's designee.		
24	(4)	The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services, or the		
25		Secretary's designee.a designee of the Secretary affiliated with the		
26		Department's Division of Child Development.		
27	(5)	The Assistant Secretary of the Department of Commerce, Division of		
28		Employment Security, or the Assistant Secretary's designee.		
29	(6)	The Secretary of the Department of Revenue, or the Secretary's designee.		
30	(7)	The Commissioner of Labor, or the Commissioner's designee.		
31	(8)	The President of the North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities,		
32		Inc., or the President's designee.		
33	(9)	The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, Department of Transportation, or the		
34		Commissioner's designee.		
35	(10)	The State Chief Information Officer. Officer, or a designee of the Officer

2	(12) Three public members appointed by the General Assembly upon the
3	recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
4	(13) Three public members appointed by the General Assembly upon the
5	recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
6	(14) One public member appointed by the Governor, to serve at the Governor's
7	pleasure.
8	(b) Appointed members of the Board shall serve terms of four years. Terms of
9	appointed members shall begin May 1, 2013, and every four years thereafter. Appointed
10	members may be reappointed but shall not serve more than two consecutive terms. Vacancies
11	among appointed members shall be filled by the appointing entity and shall be for the
12	remainder of the vacant term.
13	(c) The chair of the Board shall be the State Chief Information Officer. The Board shall
14	elect from the appointed members a <u>chair and a</u> vice-chair for a term of two years.
15	(d) Members of the Board shall receive such per diem compensation and necessary
16	travel and subsistence expenses while engaged in the official discharge of the official duties as
17	is provided by law for members of State boards and commissions.
18	(e) The Board shall hold an initial meeting upon appointment of a majority of the
19	appointed members. The Board shall meet at least quarterly, but may meet more frequently
20	upon the call of the chair."
21 22	SECTION 3. G.S. 116E-4 reads as rewritten:
22	 (a) The <u>Center Board</u> shall have the following powers and <u>duties with respect to the</u>

26	(4) Before the use of any individual data in the System, the <u>Center-Board</u> shall

30	other privacy measures, as required by law or the <u>Center.Board.</u>
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32	(9) Establish an advisory committee on data quality to advise the <u>Center-Board</u>
33	on issues related to data auditing and tracking to ensure data validity.
34	(b) The <u>Center Board</u> shall adopt rules according to Chapter 150B of the General
35	Statutes as provided in G.S. 116E-6 to implement the provisions of this Article.
36	(c) The <u>Center-Board</u> shall report quarterly to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight
37	Committee, the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, and the Joint
38	Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology beginning September 30, 2013.
39	The report shall include the following:
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41	(3) Any other recommendations made by the <u>Center, Board</u> , including the most
42	effective and efficient configuration for the System."
43	SECTION 4. G.S. 116E-6 reads as rewritten:
44	"§ 116E-6. Data sharing.
45	(a) Local school administrative units, charter schools, community colleges, constituent
46	institutions of The University of North Carolina, and State agencies shall do all of the
47	following:
48	(1) Comply with the data requirements and implementation schedule for the
49	System as set forth by the Center.Board.

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1	(2) Transfer student data and workforce data to the System in accordance with
2	the data security and safeguarding plan developed by the Center Board under
3	G.S. 116E-5.
4	(b) Private colleges and universities, the North Carolina Independent Colleges and
5	Universities, Inc., and nonpublic schools may transfer student data and workforce data to the
6	System in accordance with the data security and safeguarding plan developed by the Board
7	under G.S. 116E-5."
8	SECTION 5. G.S. 120-123(81), 143B-1321(a)(31), and 143B-1322(c)(21) are
9	reenacted as they existed immediately before their repeal.
10	SECTION 6. The North Carolina Longitudinal Data System Board shall adopt
11	rules pursuant to G.S. 116E-4 no later than December 1, 2017.
12	SECTION 7. This act is effective when it becomes law.
