1 Constitutional amendment to allow a business owner to bring an inverse 2 condemnation action if the owner's business is partially or completely closed by an order issued 3 by the Governor or a unit of local government due to a state of emergency declared by the 4 Governor."

5 **SECTION 3.** If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the amendment 6 set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the amendment to the 7 Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so certified among the 8 permanent records of that office. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act becomes 9 effective upon certification and applies to business closures on or after that date.

10 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
