A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO CLARIFY ELIGIBLE USES OF FIRE PROTECTION TAX REVENUES. 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 4 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 69-25.5 reads as rewritten: 5 "§ 69-25.5. Methods of providing fire protection. 6 Upon the levy of such tax, the board of county commissioners shall, to the extent of the taxes 7 collected hereunder, provide fire protection for the district district by doing one of the following: 8 By contracting Contracting with any incorporated city or town, with any (1) 9 incorporated nonprofit volunteer or community fire department, or with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to furnish fire protection, 10 orprotection. 12 By furnishing Furnishing fire protection itself if the county maintains an (2) 13 organized fire department, ordepartment. By establishing Establishing a fire department department within the district, 14 (3) 15 ordistrict. By utilizing Utilizing any two or more of the above listed methods of 16 (4) 17 furnishing fire protection. A fire department must meet the minimum public protection requirements established by the 18 19 Office of State Fire Marshall of the Department of Insurance in order to receive any portion of the tax levied and collected under G.S. 69-25.4." 20 21 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 153A-301(a) reads as rewritten: 22 The board of commissioners of any county may define any number of service districts 23 in order to finance, provide, or maintain for the districts one or more of the following services, facilities and functions in addition to or to a greater extent than those financed, provided or 24 25 maintained for the entire county: 26 Beach erosion control and flood and hurricane protection works. (1) 27

Fire protection.protection by one or more fire departments that meet the (2) minimum public protection requirements established by the Office of State Fire Marshall of the Department of Insurance.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2019.



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
