The report shall include 29 expenditures of both State and federal funds and shall be in sufficient detail that the county can 30 be identified. A full account of each road project shall be kept by and under the direction of the 31 Department of Transportation or its representatives, to ascertain at any time the expenditures and the liabilities against all projects; also records of contracts and force account work. The account 32 33 records, together with all supporting documents, shall be open at all times to the inspection of 34 the Governor or road authorities of any county, or their authorized representatives, and copies 35 thereof shall be furnished such officials upon request.

24	(a) Intent. – It is the intent of the General Assembly that North Carolina's reputation as
25	the "Good Roads State" is restored, which requires a partnership between the Governor, the
26	Department of Transportation, the General Assembly, and all North Carolina citizens. Further,
27	the General Assembly finds that improving the condition of North Carolina's roads requires
28	increased oversight, accountability, innovation, and efficiency. It is the belief of the General
29	Assembly that, through increased transparency and responsiveness to the public, the condition of
30	the roads in this State will be the best in the nation within 10 years.
31	(b) Establishment and Components. – To achieve the intent set forth in subsection (a) of
32 33	this section, the Department shall establish and implement the "DOT Report" Program
33 34	(Program). The Program shall include the following components:(1) Responsiveness. – The Department shall structure the Program to gather
35	citizen input and shall commit to quickly addressing structural problems and
36	other road hazards on State-maintained roads. Citizens may report potholes,
37	drainage issues, culvert blockages, guardrail repairs, damaged or missing
38	signs, malfunctioning traffic lights, highway debris, or shoulder damage to the
39	Department of Transportation by calling a toll-free telephone number
40	designated by the Department or submitting an online work request through a
41	Web site link designated by the Department. Beginning January 1, 2016, upon
42	receiving a citizen report in accordance with this subdivision, the Department
3	shall either address the reported problem or identify a solution to the reported
4	problem. Excluding potholes, which shall be repaired within two business
5	days of the date the report is received, the Department of Transportation shall
6	properly address (i) safety-related citizen reports no later than 10 business

Prior to exercising an exemption authorized under this 17 subsection, the North Carolina State Ports Authority, through its Executive Director, shall give 18 notice in writing of the Authority's intent to exercise the exemption to the Secretary of 19 Administration. The notice shall contain, at a minimum, the following information: (i) the 20 specific statutory requirement or requirements from which the Authority intends to exercise an 21 exemption; (ii) the reason the exemption is necessary to expedite delivery of a port facility; and 22 (iii) the way the Authority anticipates the exemption will expedite the delivery of a port facility. 23 The Authority shall report quarterly to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental 24 Operations on any building contracts exceeding two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) 25 to which an exemption authorized by this subsection is applied applied within 60 days of signing 26 the contract." 27 28 ELIMINATE REPORTING REQUIREMENT ON PROJECTS LET WITHOUT A 29 **PERFORMANCE BOND** 30 SECTION 16. Section 1.2 of S.L. 2010-148 reads as rewritten: 31 "SECTION 1.2. The Department of Transportation ("DOT"), The University of North 32 Carolina and its constituent institutions ("UNC"), and the Department of Administration 33 ("DOA") shall monitor all projects in those agencies and institutions that are let without a 34 performance or payment bond to determine the number of defaults on those projects, the cost to 35 complete each defaulted project, and each project's contract price. Beginning March 1, 2011, 36 and annually thereafter, DOT, UNC, and DOA shall report this information to the Joint 37 Legislative Committee on Governmental Operations." 38 39 **REPEAL BID THRESHOLD INCREASE REPORT** 40 SECTION 17.
