**SECTION 3.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative Office of the Courts the sum of sixty-seven thousand six hundred three dollars (\$67,603) for the 2019-2020 fiscal year and one hundred seventy-three thousand eight hundred eight dollars (\$173,808) for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

**SECTION 4.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective January 1, 2021, and elections conducted in 2020 shall be conducted in accordance with the judgeships created in Section 1. The remainder of this act is effective July 1, 2019.
