A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION TO ISSUE A NEW REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL TO LEASE OR PURCHASE OFFICE SPACE FOR THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.(a)** Section 34.24(b) of S.L. 2018-5 reads as rewritten:

"SECTION 34.24.(b) By no later than August 1, 2018, the <u>The</u> Department of Administration shall issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) seeking leased office space or spaces for lease or purchase for the Division of Motor Vehicles employees and contractors currently working at the Division building located on New Bern Avenue in the City of Raleigh. The geographic scope of the RFP shall include Wake County and surrounding counties."

**SECTION 1.(b)** The Department of Administration shall issue the RFP required under subsection (a) of this section within 15 days of the date this act becomes effective.

**SECTION 2.** At least thirty days prior to approval by the Council of State of the lease or purchase of office space for the Division of Motor Vehicles, the Department of Administration shall submit a report to the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee, the House of Representatives Appropriations Committee on Transportation, and the Senate Appropriations Committee on the Department of Transportation detailing the agreement.

**SECTION 3.** The Department of Administration shall not execute an agreement to lease office space pursuant to the RFP issued under Section 34.24(b) of S.L. 2018-5.

**SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
