20	The Department of Public Safety may provide to the Legislative Services Officer from the			
20	-	tional Repositories of Criminal Histories the criminal history of any c		
22	prospective employee, volunteer, or contractor of the Legislative Services Commission. The			
23	Legislative Services Officer shall provide to the Department of Public Safety, along with the			
24	request, the fingerprints of the current or prospective employee, volunteer, or contractor, a form			
25	signed by the current or prospective employee, volunteer, or contractor consenting to the criminal			
26	record check and use of fingerprints and other identifying information required by the State and			
27	National Repositories, and any additional information required by the Department of Public			
28	Safety. The fingerprints of the current or prospective employee, volunteer, or contractor shall be			
29	forwarded to the State Bureau of Investigation for a search of the State's criminal history record			
30	file, and the State Bureau of Investigation shall forward a set of fingerprints to the Federal Bureau			
31	of Investigation for a national criminal history record check. The Legislative Services Officer			
32	shall keep all information obtained pursuant to this section confidential. The Department of			
33	Public Safety	may charge a fee to offset the cost incurred by it to conduct a criminal reco	ord check	
34	under this sec	tion. The fee shall not exceed the actual cost of locating, editing, researc	hing, and	

retrieving the information."
