9	miscarriage, the attending physician shall obtain consent from the mother before disposing of the		
10	fetal remains. If the mother is unable to give consent, and the father is known and able to be		
11	contacted within seven days, the attending physician shall obtain consent from the father before		
12		the fetal remains. If neither the mother nor the father is able or available	-
13		fetal remains shall be disposed of in accordance with applicable laws and regulated in the second se	
14 15		n every instance of fetal death resulting from accidental injury, stillb	
15 16		the attending physician or individual in charge of the institution where the ad or extracted shall, upon request of the mother or father, release to the
