22	SECTION 2.2. The allotment reduction to support the State-level operations and	
23	administration of the NCVPS required by G.S. 115C-238.76(b), as enacted by this act, shall be	
24	in the amount of at least three million seven hundred sixty thousand eight hundred sixteen dollar	
25	(\$3,760,816), as was effective for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. In accordance with	
26	G.S. 115C-238.76(b), this allotment reduction amount shall be adjusted annually based upon the	
27	percentage growth in NCVPS enrollment to ensure the expansion of services due to increased	1
28	student enrollment in NCVPS courses.	
29	SECTION 2.3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2019, and applies beginning with	1

30 the 2019-2020 school year.
