Whereas, Ombudsmen serve and protect some of the most vulnerable and needy

Whereas, Ombudsmen serve and protect some of the most vulnerable and needy
citizens in our State—residents of nursing homes, adult care homes, and family care homes; and
Whereas, Ombudsmen advocate for residents' rights; work to improve the quality of
care provided in facilities; and assist residents, family members, and providers in resolving
potentially contentious issues without resorting to formal complaint processes, thereby saving
the State and residents time and resources; and

## Whereas, the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Aging and Adult Services, oversees the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program; Now, therefore, The General Assembly of North Caroline anasts:

15 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

16 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 17 Health and Human Services, Division of Aging and Adult Services, the sum of nine hundred fifty 18 thousand dollars (\$950,000) in recurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year and the sum of nine 19 hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$950,000) in recurring funds for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, to 20 create 10 full-time equivalent ombudsman positions within the Office of the State Long-Term 21 Care Ombudsman in the Division of Aging and Adult Services, in order to move North Carolina 22 towards national standards for long-term care ombudsman programs.

23 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2019.
