1	SECTION 3. Article 16 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new section to read:
3	"§ 130A-386.5. Confidentiality of certain death investigation information and records
4	received by the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner.
5	All information and records provided by a city, county, or other public entity to the Office of
6	the Chief Medical Examiner, or its agents, concerning a death investigation shall retain the same
7	degree of confidentiality it had while in the possession of the city, county, or other public entity.
8	Such information and records shall not become public records, as defined under Chapters 121
9	and 132 of the General Statutes, when provided to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, or
10	its agents, unless the information and records otherwise constituted public records while in the
11	possession of the city, county, or other public entity."
12	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
