5	SECTION 1. G.S. 143-215.107A(c) reads as rewritten:		
6	"(c) Co	ounties Covered. – Motor vehicle emissions inspections shall be performed in the	
7	following cou	inties: Alamance, Buncombe, Cabarrus, Cumberland, Davidson, Durham, Forsyth,	
8	Franklin, Gaston, Guilford, Iredell, Johnston, Lee, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, New Hanover,		
9	Onslow, Randolph, Rockingham, Rowan, Union, and Wake."		
10	SECTION 2. No later than September 30, 2019, the Department of Environmental		
11	Quality shall prepare and submit to the United States Environmental Protection Agency for		
12	approval by that agency a proposed North Carolina State Implementation Plan amendment based		
13	on the change to the motor vehicle emissions testing program provided in this act.		
14	SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act becomes effective on the later of the following		
15	dates and applies to motor vehicles inspected, or due to be inspected, on or after that effective		
16	date:

24		inspection mechanic license holders, emissions inspection station licensees,
