To approve requests by municipalities, counties, and other <u>b.</u> governmental entities to use land or right-of-way owned by the Department of Transportation that is encumbered by utility easements, or otherwise being lawfully occupied by a public utility, for the installation and use of automatic license plate reader systems; provided that (i) the use of the land or right-of-way is temporary in nature; (ii) the automatic license plate reader system shall be completely aboveground, easily moveable, and contain no combustible fuel; (iii) the use shall not unreasonably interfere with the operation and maintenance of the utility facilities or cause the utility
