## SESSION LAW 2019-48 SENATE BILL 148

AN ACT TO ALLOW LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES TO DISCLOSE OR RELEASE RECORDINGS FOR PURPOSES OF SUSPECT IDENTIFICATION OR APPREHENSION OR TO LOCATE A MISSING OR ABDUCTED PERSON.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

## **SECTION 1.** G.S. 132-1.4A(h) reads as rewritten:

- "(h) Release of Recordings; Law Enforcement Purposes. Notwithstanding the requirements of subsections (c), (f), and (g) of this section, a custodial law enforcement agency shall disclose or release a recording to a district attorney (i) for review of potential criminal charges, (ii) in order to comply with discovery requirements in a criminal prosecution, (iii) for use in criminal proceedings in district court, or (iv) <u>for</u> any other law enforcement purpose, and may disclose or release a recording for any of the following purposes:
  - (1) For law enforcement training purposes.
  - (2) Within the custodial law enforcement agency for any administrative, training, or law enforcement purpose.
  - (3) To another law enforcement agency for law enforcement purposes.
  - (4) For suspect identification or apprehension.
  - (5) To locate a missing or abducted person."

**SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
